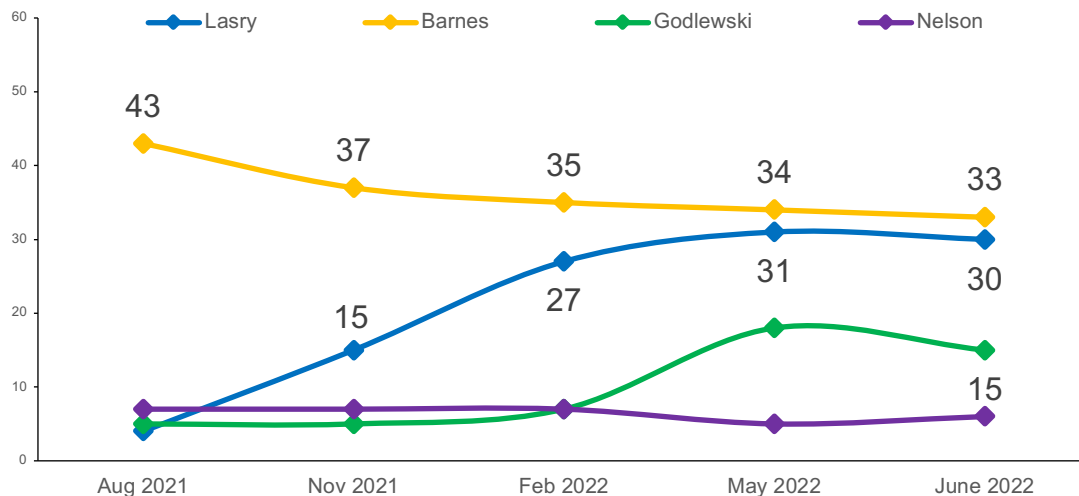

The following is a summary of findings from a hybrid survey conducted among 600 likely Democratic primary voters in Wisconsin. Respondents were reached using live interviewers on both landlines and mobile phones, as well as a voter-file matched online panel. Interviews were conducted June 13-16, 2022. The sampling error for this survey is $\pm 4.0\%$.

Alex Lasry Locked in a Statistical Tie and is the Best Democrat to Beat Ron Johnson

In the Democratic Primary for U.S. Senate in Wisconsin, Alex Lasry maintained his support and remains in a statistical tie with Lieutenant Governor Mandela Barnes even weeks after Barnes launched his television campaign. He trails just 30% to 33%, a gap within the margin of error for this poll.

Not only has Barnes's television failed to increase his support, but State Treasurer Sarah Godlewski, who had experienced a significant uptick since launching her paid media campaign, is now leaking some support dropping from 18% to 15% over the last month.



Democratic primary voters continue to believe that Alex Lasry is the Democrat who can beat Ron Johnson.

More voters (36%) believe that Alex Lasry has the best chance to beat Ron Johnson, while just 28% say that describes Mandela Barnes and even fewer Sarah Godlewski (11%).
